How it works

The IPC Learning Platform, reachable on www.learning.ipcinfo.org, is a user-friendly, fast and secure cloud-based application designed by the IPC to manage and monitor all learning activities from an operational perspective, even if only certain activities (namely the e-learning courses, tests, etc.) will be accessible via the platform from the user perspective. The IPC Learning Platform will also be used to track 'offline' activities, such as face-to-face training sessions, the Cross-Country Learning Exchange Programme (CCLE), and other learning and certification activities that are non-digital.

While the IPC Learning Platform has been set up to deliver IPC learning activities, it is only a technological platform, which will run on a hosted server. It cannot, in itself, deliver the content and monitor activities. This will be accomplished by the IPC team, comprised of both full-time and part-time experts, by using the learning platform.

THE IPC LEARNING PLATFORM

Using technology to improve its learning processes, the Integrated Food Security Phase Classification (IPC) has launched a new Learning Platform, making learning more virtual rather than relying solely on a face-to-face approach. The IPC Learning Platform uses innovative technologies to provide a wider array of learning experiences, reach a broader range of practitioners, improve the capture and sharing of IPC expert knowledge, and better monitor and report on progress at country, regional, and global levels.

Through this platform, you can work towards your IPC certifications (refer to the second page for a detailed explanation of the certifications). The platform includes self-learning introductory courses to the three IPC Scales - Acute Food Insecurity, Chronic Food Insecurity, and Acute Malnutrition - which are a good way to familiarise yourself with these scales. You can then have a look at upcoming IPC training opportunities and analyses through the IPC Events calendar on the platform, and contact the person in your region to participate. Participating in or supporting IPC training activities and analyses are key steps towards getting certified. You can finally do the online test for each scale on the platform, to get certified officially. The platform also provides a library with relevant reading materials.

For online learning activities to count towards IPC certification, all activities need to be recorded within a user's profile. It is strongly recommended that all users register as a user and carry out learning logged in, so that learning activities are recorded and can be counted towards certification. Activities undertaken as a guest user will not count towards certification.
